The K12 program will help correct this deficiency by training a new generation of biomedical scientists for whom glycans are an integral component of their knowledge base.

Applicants must be U. S. Citizens or Permanent Residents at the time of application and can hold the degree of PhD, MD or MD/PhD. Candidates from groups underrepresented in biomedical sciences or with disabilities are strongly encouraged to apply. All Scholars must first apply directly to an approved faculty mentor with whom they wish to carry out postdoctoral research.
